St. Ignatius was the third bishop at Antioch, following St. Evodius who succeeded St. Peter there. A tradition says that he was held on the knee of Our Lord when the Savior spoke the words "Suffer the little children to come unto me." During the persecution of Trajan he was condemned to death and sent in chains to Rome. While on the way he wrote letters to various churches; he rejoiced when he heard the roaring of the lions set loose to devour him. He was martyred at Rome on October 17, about the year 110. He is commemorated every day in the Canon of the Mass, in the prayer Nobis quoque peccatoribus,
