

This group of Persian martyrs, consisted of a husband, wife, and two sons. The men were beheaded and their bodies burnt. Martha was killed and her body thrown into a well. They came to Rome under the Emperor Claudius II and visited Christians cast into prison, and buried the slain.

The Mass for their feast is very ancient and in excellent liturgical form.
