monks at Monte Cassino; he died at the Abbey of Fossanova in 1274. He is called the "Angel of the Schools." The special glory of St. Thomas, his most salient virtue, is the profound love which he shows for the sacred tradition of the Church. He appears almost to be one with it, and has therefore become its most authoritative interpreter. It would, indeed, not be easy to find in the annals of Christianity a more inspired mind, reflecting better the perfections of the

angelic spirits than that of the great Dominican, who, building upon the foundations laid by the ancient Fathers of the Church, gave with marvelous accuracy a definite form to our knowledge of God.
