

MARCH 9, ST. FRANCES OF ROME, WIDOW

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St. Frances, a noble Roman lady, married at the age of 11, was for forty years a perfect Christian spouse. Pope Innocent X placed her name in the Calendar of the Church as a striking example and heavenly patron of the state of widowhood.

She was professed as an Oblate of the Basilica of Sta. Maria Nova under the rule of St. Benedict. She renounced all her possessions and labored for the poor even joining crowds of beggars asking for alms. She died 1440.

She reaches out her hands to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy. She fears not the snow for her household; all her charges are doubly clothed. She makes her own coverlets; fine linen and purple are her clothing. Her husband is prominent at the city gates as he sits with the elders of the land. She makes garments and sells them, and stocks the merchants with belts. She is clothed with strength and dignity, and she laughs at the days to come. She opens her mouth in wisdom, and on her tongue is kindly counsel. She watches the conduct of her household, and eats not her food in idleness. Her children rise up and praise her; her husband, too, extols her: Many are the women of proven worth, but you have excelled them all. Charm is deceptive and beauty fleeting; the woman who fears the Lord is to be praised. Give her a reward of her labors, and let her works praise her at the city gates.
