

**MASS PROPER: TUESDAY AFTER THE 4TH SUNDAY IN LENT**

MASS *Exáudi, Deus* (violet)

**INTROIT Psalms 54: 2-3**

Exáudi, Deus, oratióne meam, et ne despéxeris deprecatióne meam: inténde in me et exáudi me. (Ps. 54: 3-4) Contristátus sum in exercitatióne mea: et conturbátus sum avoce inimíci et a tribulatióne peccatóris. Glória Patri et Fílio et Spirítui Sancto, sicut erat in princípío, et nunc, et semper, et in sæcula sæculórum. Amen. Exáudi, Deus, oratióne meam, et ne despéxeris deprecatióne meam: inténde in me et exáudi me.

Hearken, O God, to my prayer; turn not away from my pleading; give heed to me, and answer me. (Ps. 54: 3-4) I rock with grief, and am troubled at the voice of the enemy and the clamor of the wicked. them, making for themselves a molten calf and worshiping it, sacrificing to it and crying out, 'This is your God, O Israel, Who brought you out of the land of Egypt!' I see how stiff-necked this people is, continued the Lord to Moses. Let Me alone, then, that My wrath may blaze up against them to consume them. Then I will make of you a great nation. But Moses implored the Lord, his God, saying, Why, O Lord, should Thy wrath blaze up against Thine own people, whom Thou brought out of the land of Egypt with such great power and with so strong a hand? Why should the Egyptians say, 'With evil intent He brought them out, that He might kill them in the mountains and exterminate them from the face of the earth'? Let Thy blazing wrath die down; relent in punishing Thy people. Remember Thy servants Abraham, Isaac and Israel, and how Thou swore to them by Thine own self, saying, 'I will make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky; and all this land that I promised, I will give your descendants as their perpetual heritage.' So the Lord relented in the punishment He had threatened to inflict on His people.

Arise, O Lord, help us! Redeem us for Thy Name's sake. O God, our ears have heard, our fathers have declared to us the deeds Thou did in their days, in days of old.

At that time, when the feast was already half over, Jesus went up into the temple and began to teach. And the Jews marveled, saying, How does this man come by learning, since He has not studied? Jesus answered

them and said, My teaching is not My own, but His Who sent Me. If anyone desires to do His will, he will know of the teaching whether it is from God, or whether I speak on My own authority. He who speaks on his own authority seeks his own glory. But he who seeks the glory of the one who sent him is truthful, and there is no injustice in him. Did not Moses give you the Law, and none of you observes the Law? Why do you seek to put Me to death? The crowd answered and said, You have a devil. Who seeks to put You to death? Jesus answered and said to them, One work I did and you all wonder. For this reason Moses gave you the circumcision - not that it is from Moses, but from the fathers - and on a Sabbath you circumcise a man. If a man receives circumcision on a Sabbath, that the Law of Moses may not be broken, are you indignant with me because I made a whole man well on a Sabbath? Judge not by appearances but give just judgment. Some therefore of the people of Jerusalem were saying, Is not this the man they seek to kill? And behold, He speaks openly and they say nothing to Him. Can it be that the rulers have really come to know that this is the Christ? Yet we know where this man is from; but when the Christ comes, no one will know where He is from. Jesus therefore, while teaching in the temple, cried out and said, You both know Me, and know where I am from. Yet I have not come of Myself, but He is true Who has sent Me, whom you do not know. I know Him because I am from Him, and He sent Me. They wanted therefore to seize Him, but no one laid hands on Him because His hour had not yet come. Many of the people, however, believed in Him.
